Topics covered will include: aviation, surface transportation, and maritime shipping security; border security and terrorist travel, including biometrics, document security, the visa waiver program, and the implementation of the US-VISIT entry/exit system; and emergency preparedness policy, especially the risk-based allocation of homeland security funding, and making radio spectrum available for public safety communications.
