Jamie Gorelick, a member of the board of the 9/11 Public Discourse Project, is a former member of the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks Upon the United States (9/11 Commission). From 1994 to 1997 she served as Deputy Attorney General of the United States. She is currently a partner at Wilmer, Cutler, Pickering, Hale & Dorr.

Dick Thornburgh

Dick Thornburgh served as Governor of Pennsylvania from 1979 through 1987, the first Republican ever to hold two successive terms in that office. From 1988-1991, he served as Attorney General of the United States under Presidents Reagan and Bush. Most recently, he chaired a National Academy for Public Administration panel examining the FBI's efforts to update its counterterrorism capabilities, and integrate intelligence into its core mission. He is currently counsel to the international law firm of Kirkpatrick & Lockhart Nicholson Graham LLP, resident in its Washington, D.C. office.

John Gannon

A former Naval Officer and Viet Nam veteran, Mr. Gannon served for twenty-four years at the CIA, attaining the senior-most analytic positions. He later worked in key homeland security assignments in the White House and the Congress, including serving as Staff Director on the House Select Committee on Homeland Security for 2 years. President Bush recently awarded him the National Security Medal, the country's highest intelligence award. Mr. Gannon recently joined BAE Systems (British Aerospace) to serve as Vice President for Global Analysis.

Chitra Ragavan

Chitra Ragavan is Chief Legal Affairs Correspondent for *U.S. News and World Report*. Ragavan joined *U.S. News* in 1998 and has since covered the Justice Department for the magazine. She has written ten cover stories - including exclusive profiles of Attorney General John Ashcroft and FBI director Robert Mueller. She has written extensively about the CIA and the FBI in the post-9/11 environment.
