Bob Kerrey, a member of the board of the 9/11 Public Discourse Project, is a former member of the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks Upon the United States (9/11 Commission). From 1988-2000, Kerrey represented Nebraska in the United States Senate. Before that he served one four-year term as Nebraska's Governor. He is currently President of New School University in New York.

The Hon. Clark Kent Ervin

Mr. Ervin was the first inspector general of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), serving from the department's first day in Jan. 2003 until Dec. 2004. Prior to his service at DHS, Mr. Ervin served as the Inspector General of the Department of State and the Broadcasting Board of Governors. From 1999 until April 2001, he served as Deputy Attorney General, General Counsel, and Director of Administration in the office of then Texas Attorney General John Cornyn.

The Hon. C. Stewart Verdery, Jr.

Mr. Verdery is a principal at Mehlman Vogel Castagnetti, Inc., a government affairs firm, and an Adjunct Fellow at the Center for Strategic and International Studies. He served as Assistant Secretary for Border and Transportation Security Policy at the Department of Homeland Security from 2003-2005. He previously served as General Counsel to Oklahoma Senator Don Nickles and as counsel to the Senate Judiciary and Rules Committees.

Dr. Stephen Flynn

Dr. Flynn is the author of the bestselling *America the Vulnerable: How Our Government Is Failing to Protect Us from Terrorism*. Dr. Flynn served as Director and principal author for the task force report "America: Still Unprepared—Still in Danger," co-chaired by former Senators Gary Hart and Warren Rudman. He spent twenty years as a commissioned officer in the U.S. Coast Guard. Dr. Flynn is currently the Jeane J. Kirkpatrick Chair in National Security Studies at the Council on Foreign Relations.

William Raisch

Bill Raisch serves as the founding Director of The International Center for Enterprise Preparedness (INTERCEP) at New York University. The Center is the world's first major academic center dedicated to private sector emergency preparedness. INTERCEP focuses on education, performance measures and research in the integration of risk management, business continuity, security and emergency management in the business environment.

Mayor Edward M. Lambert, Jr.

Edward M. Lambert, Jr. has served as Mayor of the City of Fall River, Massachusetts since January 1996. He served from 2001-2002 as President of the Massachusetts Mayor's Association. Prior to being elected Mayor, Lambert served for seven years as Member of the Massachusetts House of Representatives. He currently represents the National League of Cities.
