Slade Gorton, Moderator



Slade Gorton, a member of the board of the 9/11 Public Discourse Project, is a former member of the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks Upon the United States (9/11 Commission). Gorton represented Washington State in the United States Senate for 18 years, from 1982-2000. While in the Senate, Gorton served on the Appropriations, Budget, Commerce, Science and Transportation, and Energy and Natural Resources Committees. He is currently of counsel at Preston Gates & Ellis LLP.

Chairman Pat Roberts

Senator Pat Roberts serves as Chairman of the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence. He represented Kansas's fourth congressional district in the House for eight years, and is currently serving his second term as United States Senator. Senator Roberts is widely recognized as a leader on national security issues and a driving force leading the country to improve its intelligence gathering and analysis capabilities.

Ambassador Thomas S. Foley

Thomas S. Foley represented Washington's fifth congressional district in Congress from 1965 through 1995. In 1989, he was elected Speaker of the House of Representatives, and served as Speaker until he left Congress in 1994. In 1997, Foley was appointed U.S. Ambassador to Japan by President Bill Clinton, in which capacity he served until 2001. Ambassador Foley is currently a partner at Akin, Gump, Strauss, Hauer and Feld, LLP.
